

## Neighborhood Programs Advance

**What began in 2013 as a pilot program in Henrietta has grown six fold.** ESLC's Neighborhood Programs promote health, wellness and independence in seniors throughout Monroe County through fitness classes, nutrition education, health and wellness education, social gatherings, and intergenerational programming; community gardens and transportation are also core components. Members have the opportunity to become connected to an organization that they can trust, especially when a need arises for future supports.

Participation in these Neighborhood Programs is not only a fun experience for members but also proves to be a healthy one. According to a recent health survey, more than 68 percent of participants report they have increased consumption of fruits and vegetables since becoming a member of the program, 43 percent have decreased incidences of falls, and 91 percent report carrying over what is learned in health education classes to their life outside of class.

Whether it is ZUMBA, Yoga, hula hooping or SilverSneakers, 75 percent of our members are attending at least one exercise program each week. All of these measurable achievements are outstanding, however equally important yet less quantifiable is the secondary benefit that can't be ignored – relationship building. The program has served as the catalyst between being engaged and a part of a community where many lifelong friendships have been established.

As the Neighborhood Programs continue to expand,

# THE DAVENPORT-HATCH FOUNDATION, INC.

**For Tom Hildebrandt and Doug Taylor, giving back to the Rochester community through The Davenport-Hatch Foundation is a blessing.** They are cousins and third generation members of The Foundation to a board of thirteen. Tom serves as Vice President, Treasurer and Grants Committee Chair, and Doug is Secretary.

The Davenport-Hatch Foundation is a private foundation which was founded in 1952 by Mr. Augustus T. Hatch, in memory of his sister, Edith, who was married to his business partner, Will Davenport. Together these two gentlemen established and operated Davenport Machine Tool Company, a manufacturing business in Rochester. In the early days, gifts were small and dependent on the company's profits; nonetheless providing community support became a large part of the family's core values.

The Foundation mainly supports capital projects for the arts, health care and medical research, children and youth, social services, and educational and religious organizations, and all dollars stay in the Rochester area. When asked how funding decisions are made, Tom said there is much thought that goes into the grant evaluation process. "Knowing and trusting the leaders of any organization we support makes it easier for us to strongly consider an application," said Tom. "Great ideas stem from ESLC and the leaders are visionary, both of which are important factors that we consider."

As ESLC continues to serve seniors in innovative ways, Tom and Doug feel that ESLC's *Vision 2020* is good strategic planning, and agree that partnerships are the key to success in any industry. "Collaboration is crucial—you can't go it alone anymore, especially in senior care," said Tom. Doug echoes that sentiment. "It's important not to duplicate services, and is something we consider when evaluating grant requests," said Doug. "When we see similar requests at the same time, we have to ask ourselves if it is wise to fund all versus just one proposal that includes community partnerships to reach the same outcome." Tom regularly communicates with other local foundations and is active on many boards, so he has a pulse on community efforts and projects that are already being supported.

Over the years, ESLC is dedicated to redefining aging services in our community—a crusade that The Davenport-Hatch Foundation has been an unwavering partner in by offering funding to build new or renovate communities,

purchase vehicles, update learning space, and install environmental safety features. The Foundation's support, though subtle in recognition, positively impacts the lives of seniors throughout Monroe County and in each of the organization's programs.

Community impact is one of the most gratifying aspects of being involved in The Foundation for Doug. "I enjoy seeing first-hand how the distribution of funds helps people throughout this community," said Doug. "It's rewarding!"

Tom's gratitude is similar. "Every day we are grateful that our grandfather gave us this opportunity....to give back to the community," said Tom. "He gave us the vehicle that has kept us together for four generations now—we wouldn't be as close as a family, and keeping the family together is really special." Tom and Doug say that they all respect each other and work well as a group because they are like-minded, and share in The Foundation's mission and goals.

As the Board works to prepare the next generation to lead The Foundation, the cousins hope to continue the relationship with ESLC. They will remain open to new ideas, consider what is important to the leaders and look at what is most difficult to get funded. With no paid staff or physical location, they are able to donate more to this community and are pleased that ESLC is one of those organizations. And for them, giving back in any way possible is a gift in itself.
