Artists’ Biography:

Ken has been taking pictures and processing them himself since college, and Shelley has been drawing and painting for as long as she can remember. Twelve years ago they combined their talents and began exhibiting as a team at local art shows, such as Clothesline Art Show, Fairport Canal Days, and the Canandaigua Waterfront Art Festival. Many of their pictures' subjects reflect their favorite places in the Rochester area and in New England. Ken uses natural wood and finishing to create tabletop decorations, such as pine trees, stars, and plaques that represent the shapes of different states and countries.

While it would be fun to spend all of their time creating beautiful artwork, Ken and Shelley also work outside of the home. Ken is an electrical engineer, and is the one whom friends call on for help with home improvement projects. Shelley works as an ESOL (English as a Second Language) substitute teacher and volunteers in the community. On most Saturdays, you will find her with her favorite painting student, a very special woman who puts heart and soul into her creations. Ken and Shelley have a son and daughter who work professionally in the education, lighting design and logistics management of international exhibitions.

Ken and Shelley have a common interest in capturing the essence and details of their subjects in order to create a meaningful artistic experience for those who view their work. Their specialties include flowers, seascapes, and iconic local scenes such as barns and lighthouses.
