I am pleased to announce the following new updates:

Visitation

Beginning Monday, June 22, Beatrice Place will be open for visitors with the following precautions:

- Visiting hours are from 8:00 a.m. to 4:00 p.m. Monday through Friday only. **Weekend visits are still restricted.**
- Only two guests per apartment are permitted at a time. This includes medical personnel as well as other guests.
- No overnight guests are allowed.
- All visitors will be screened, and temperatures will be taken upon arrival at the front desk. Please do not buzz them in from your apartment.
- Masks must be worn throughout the building, and visitors should move directly to and from the apartment without stopping in any community areas. At no point should people be gathering or sitting in common areas (guests, personal care aides, residents) until further notice.
- While in the apartment, I remind you that you should maintain social distance where possible and practice hand washing/sanitizing, per usual.

Outings

Many of you have inquired about visiting family/friends for the day or overnight and the need to quarantine upon return. Effective immediately, there will be no required quarantine following a social outing. However, upon return you will be asked screening questions and have your temperature taken. Please arrange this screening with me before leaving.

As restrictions begin to ease and the community opens up, it remains ***absolutely essential*** that we continue to honor all COVID-19 precautions. **Wearing masks, practicing good hand hygiene and social distancing remains our best defense against this virus and a resurgence in the community.**
